

### 4 NIGHTS

This 4-night cruise starts at Guwahati and terminates at Silghat near Kaziranga. Discover Assam's rich silk-weaving heritage and learn about the process of sericulture by visiting village homes. Spend time relaxing and cruising the Brahmaputra river as you wind your way to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Kaziranga National Park in search of rhinos and tigers.


### **10 NIGHTS**






## **ABN Sukapha Petit expedition ship**

With a maximum group size of 24 guests, ABN Sukapha was designed to closely resemble ABN Charaidew I, the first passenger river ship in India by the pioneers -Assam Bengal Navigation Co., both as a result of popular demand and reasons of practicality, retaining many of the features which make the original heritage passenger vessel from the 70s', the lovingly restored ABN Charaidew I, the grand old lady of the fleet.

In an effort to conserve India's forests, the ship is entirely bamboo-panelled (the green-gold of Assam) and the furniture on board is all locally made; objet d'arts in the saloon are from Assam and Bengal; and fabrics are almost all locally hand-made by weavers that we support.

Outfitted in true adventure spirit, this style of boat offers charm in vernacular eco-chic style.

### **Boutique Expedition Ship**


Inaugurated in 2019, ABN Charaidew II is a specially designed ship that is well-equipped to navigate the complex moods of the mighty Brahmaputra with an extra-shallow draught and a low profile that also allow her to cruise further upstream than any other ship on this river.

Purposely small in size at 44.5m in length, her maximum group size of 36 guests helps create an intimate atmosphere, as well as minimise the impact of tourism in these sensitive areas.


